Regular informal formative assessment tasks in all subject to identify prior learning and low stakes knowledge recall quizzes/ activities throughout topics. Do now activities will recap prior teaching and identify misconceptions. Consistent use of live marking in lessons will identify where help is needed. Summative assessments will be used at 3 key points throughout the year in line with other departments in the school. Some of the assessment material will be common to mainstream but others adapted to fit the teaching within the Connect department.

Baseline assessments done on entry into Connect in Maths and English to attain a SS. Repeated at end of year to measure progress. Dyslexia screener used at beginning of year

SEMH assessment to be done each term using EQ observations and discussions.

### ATTITUDE

Understanding others, behaviour and attitudes.

Opportunities arise across the curriculum to address issues, discuss various attitudes, build respect for all and are built into topics—discussing whether giving someone a love potion in AMND is morally correct.
